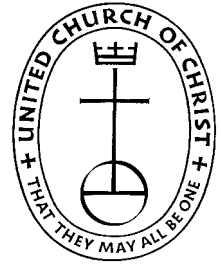

From the Interim Senior Pastor

It is with great excitement that I write to you regarding what the Cabinet has been doing. First, I want to say with certainty that the Cabinet is represented by genuinely caring, intelligent, faithful members of this congregation. We have spent many hours in deep, thoughtful discussion to reach some important conclusions. The members of this congregation can be proud and confident in the Cabinet's process and sincere concern in making sure each and every member of Lake Edge is heard and represented.

Pastor Lisa has been serving us as an incredible interim pastor. She has reminded us numerous times that it is normal for our congregation to feel anxious and even tired as we go through the many changes that we have been forced to face. This anxious and tired feeling has not missed our church leadership. We have seen some gifted lay leaders feel the need to take a break from church leadership. Our current cabinet has listened to many ideas and concerns from our congregation and each other. We decided a day focused on reconnecting and refocusing was necessary. So, the cabinet went on a day long retreat held at Fitchburg Memorial UCC. We went with the intent to enjoy Christian fellowship and prioritize the next steps necessary to move our church forward. We started our day by establishing two guiding statements:

1. The church is a human organization inspired by God to embody God's love on Earth.
2. The cabinet, faithful leaders responsible as the listening voice of the congregation, envisions a Lake Edge future inspired by the Holy Spirit.

The second half of the day long retreat was spent identifying needs the congregation has brought to the cabinet's attention. We came up with 32 identified needs. We then prioritized the top five concerns to be addressed first. These top five needs are as follows:

1. Restructure the executive committees, define their responsibilities and rewrite the church bylaws as needed.
2. Create a program for volunteer recruitment through analysis of the congregation's reported time and talents.

3. Support a year round stewardship team.
4. Increase communication between leadership committees and the congregation.
5. Create a hospitality board to foster community building and fellowship.

I hope this helps to shed some light on the work the cabinet has been doing for the church. We feel we are led by the Holy Spirit and each other to create an environment where we can all be nurtured in our faith. Please know that we always welcome you, the members of Lake Edge, to share any ideas and concerns you may have.

Restructure Team Report

At the recent retreat, cabinet members addressed current opportunities awaiting the church, including the reorganization of lay-led groups that manage various facets of church life. Lay involvement has shown encouraging growth in recent years and is apparent in the formation of teams such as Worship planning teams for both services, Family Ministry team, Identity and Evangelism, the Worship at the Edge band participation, youth leadership etc.

Current Lake Edge structure doesn't include well-defined expectations of roles and responsibilities for some groups, while "job descriptions" for other groups have become outdated; and new groups have no overall guiding structure. By-laws guiding the current structure were last updated in 1982, nearly 30 years ago! Ministry and membership at Lake Edge have changed in that time—pastoral hours are fewer, church membership is smaller with changing demographics; and an organizational structure to support lay ministry is a vital need.

At the March restructure meeting, several cabinet members met to begin planning for a restructuring process and established a timeline. The restructure team currently includes Nicole Rosenthal, Kevin Parker, and Sue Brockman

From the Interim Senior Pastor

By the time you read this Easter will be only days away. The long sojourn from Ash Wednesday to Easter will be drawing to a close. I hope that you will have been able to participate in at least one of our Holy Week services that help us move from the sorrow of Lent to the joy of Easter morning.

Sometimes it amazes me that such ancient observances of the Church seasons are so pertinent to our experiences in this time. Search Committee Update

The Lake Edge Congregational Survey <<http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/leucc>> is now available online. *Please note: This is completely separate from the one-page checklist that was handed out at worship services for the past couple of weeks.* I cannot stress enough how important it is for everyone to participate in the congregational survey, and we are urging everyone - current confirmation class and older - who regularly participates in any aspect of the life of Lake Edge to complete the survey. It is an individual survey, so every member of a household should complete the survey independently and answer the questions according to their own feelings and beliefs. A survey test group reported that it took an average of 35-45 minutes to complete the survey, so you may want to start it when you have some time to reflect on your answers.

We are planning to make a few laptop computers available in the church conference room on Sundays (except during the 3rd Sunday blood pressure screenings), so that people who cannot access the internet at home or elsewhere (work, public library, etc.) can complete the survey online between services. Members of the search committee will be available during these times to provide assistance, if needed. Of course, we know there are folks who will want or need a paper copy for a variety of reasons, and that is perfectly fine, but we hope requests for the paper version remain limited to those who have no other way of completing the survey. Paper copies will be available in the office no later than Sunday, March 21, but we are STRONGLY urging you to complete the online version for three reasons:

- Natural resource conservation (Be Green!). The printed version is many pages long and it would require a LOT of paper if we have to make a lot of copies.
- Due to the length of the printed version, copying and/or mailing them will cost money, and we would prefer to save our limited budget for other things.

- If you fill out a paper copy, someone from the search committee will have to enter it into the online version anyway so the information can be captured in the database. Unless it is absolutely necessary, duplication of effort is not our goal.

The Search Committee is committed to this search process and to finding a pastor who can best serve the needs of our church and congregation, but we cannot do that without your help, so please complete the survey within the next couple of weeks (the sooner the better) and make your thoughts and opinions known. Don't forget, you can always ask questions or provide feedback at search@lakeedge.org. This email address is not available to church staff, but goes directly to the search committee chair.

We are in the process of developing a Search Committee Web page for the Lake Edge UCC Web site <<http://www.lakeedge.org/>> This page will be dedicated to Search Committee updates, events, contact information, etc. It's not quite finished, but keep checking the Lake Edge home page. The "Search Committee" link will show up soon on the left sidebar under "Explore Lake Edge."

Heart and Soul From Your Parish Nurse

For Our Souls: "I'm so in love, every time I look at you my soul gets dizzy."
~Jesse Tyler

For Our Bodies and Minds: It can be great fun for our souls to be dizzy with love, but what about dizzy bodies? Feeling lightheaded when we rise from a sitting position, or when we move from lying to sitting, isn't (usually) a love-related event. Anyone, any age can experience orthostatic or postural hypotension (a steep, sudden temporary dip in our blood pressure).

This type of hypotension isn't dangerous unless it is symptomatic of some other problem, or if it is accompanied by blurry vision, weakness, nausea, or fainting. Some causes include: dehydration; some heart conditions; diabetes; nervous system disorders such as Parkinson's; some medications; heat exposure (i.e. long, hot showers or hot tub use); prolonged bed rest; crossing our legs at the knees for long periods of time; standing for long periods of time; and/or pregnancy.

So what should we do if we experience dizziness when we change position? First of all, we'll want to see our physician. They'll make sure there isn't some underlying disease process. Our doctor will take our blood pressure lying down, sitting, and then standing (I can also do that for you, if you like); then they'll interview us and decide if further testing is needed to determine the cause. If a medication is affecting us, our doctor may change how much we take, or try a different medication.

If there are no underlying causes and our condition is mild, we can try several things to ease the problem. First, before rising from bed: wiggle our toes and move our feet. Then we should sit for a moment at the side of our bed to make sure we aren't dizzy. After we're sure things are okay, steady ourselves and stand in place for a few seconds. Again we can try wiggling our toes, flexing our feet, or shaking our arms to get the blood moving. Rule of thumb: never jump quickly out of bed, or rise quickly from a chair - we need to give our body time to adjust to position changes.

Other things worth trying: exercise; taking plenty of fluids; avoiding bending at the waist (squatting by bending our knees is a better idea); sleeping with the head of our bed slightly elevated; avoiding prolonged periods in the hot sun, or in a hot tub; and trying compression or support stockings to aid our circulation. Some doctors also recommend increasing salt intake, however that should only be done with the supervision of our physician.

So, let's go ahead and enjoy it if our souls are dizzy with love. But as for our bodies, well folks, that's definitely another matter.

Exploring the Way

Exploring the Way is a small-group series on Christian spirituality. Designed for the Christian novice and the spiritual veteran alike, it explores the basic concepts of the Christian spiritual life, along with the biblical texts that undergird them.
